

BEHAVIOUR

Our children's very excellent behaviour is extremely important to us. All of our staff, both teaching and non-teaching, follow closely the agreed school approach which is to actively seek out good behaviour and praise and encourage the children at every opportunity.

Bad behaviour rarely occurs but when it does we have a variety of strategies that we employ. If unacceptable behaviour persists then parents/carers are informed and invited to discuss the problem with the class teacher and/or Headteacher. At all times we will work together to resolve the problem.

Bullying - continued verbal or physical abuse by an individual or group is NEVER tolerated. Children are encouraged to use a variety of ways to inform adults if they have a persistent problem with another child.

We celebrate good behaviour, and aim to always look for children doing the right thing, and we let them know how pleased we are. Throughout the Early Years Foundation Stage, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 we have methods to praise and rewards to give out for every pupil who has displayed good behaviour. These rewards are extremely effective and not only our pupils but also our staff really look forward to these being awarded.

We have recently introduced **Class Dojo** to the whole school! This is an online resource that helps to encourage children's excellent behaviour and share their best moments with parents.

We utilise this resource in three main ways:

1. To reward positive behaviour that links to our vision and values (Learn, Enjoy, Achieve, Respect and Nurture)
2. To remind children when they are not behaving in a way that reflects our vision and values
3. To share the amazing learning that is taking in place in school.

Your child will have their own avatar on their Class Dojo page. Parents/carers will be provided with a password to access their child's Class Dojo page. Through this page you will be able to view the points your child has earned, any behaviour that we feel needs work and the 'Class Story.' The 'Class Story' is a news feed that displays highlights of your child's accomplishments, achievements and creations. If you have requested that your child's image should not feature on the internet then they will not feature on their 'Class Story.'
