



INTRODUCTION TO THREE BRIDGES PRIMARY SCHOOL

The information given in this prospectus is intended for parents who are considering/have secured their child's entry to Three Bridges Primary School in 2017/18.

Information given is correct at the time of printing and includes any changes planned by the school. This prospectus should help you to make the right decision about selecting the right school for your child. It will give the important information about day-to-day life at Three Bridges Primary School.

Parents are very welcome to visit the school and meet with the Headteacher and are invited to make an appointment through the school. If you have already chosen Three Bridges Primary School for your child, arrangements will be made for you and your child to visit the school before your child starts with us.

Three Bridges Primary School is for children aged 3-11 years and is split on two sites; Lower Site and Upper Site. The Lower Site has accommodation for 334 children. There are 52 children in the nursery; 26 in the morning session and 26 in the afternoon session, however as from September 2017 the Nursery will offer parents the option of choosing 2 full days a week and will also accommodate pupils who require 30 hours a week (Government's Free Funding Scheme). There are also 272 children from 4-7 years in nine classes; 3 x Reception, 3 x Year 1 and 3 x Year 2. This site houses the Early Years Foundation Stage in the SCOLA building and is known as 'The Orchard', and also Key Stage One which is housed in the main school building. From September 2017 The Upper Site will have accommodation for 312 children from 7 - 11 years with 10 classes - 3 x Year 3, 3 x Year 4, 2 x Year 5 and 2 x Year 6. This site houses Key Stage Two and has been expanding to 3 form entry since September 2016. Each Key Stage has a separate timetable; however, there are a number of opportunities for the school to meet together as a whole.

The school also has Special Support Centres with a class base located on both sites for children with speech and language delay/disorder. The children are registered and totally integrated into one of the mainstream classes.

From 2013 the school has increased year by year to 3 form entry starting with the Reception year.
