




#### Everything you need to know about school attendance







### Year 3 Ancient Greeks

Pottery made in ancient Greece.

Its painted decoration has become the primary source of information about the development of Greek pictorial art. It was made in a variety of sizes and shapes, according to its intended use; large vessels were used for storage and transportation of liquids (wine, olive oil, water), smaller pots for perfumes and unguents.

The **Stone Age** was a broad prehistoric period during which stone was widely used to make stone tools with an edge, a point, or a percussion surface.

The **Bronze Age** was the time from around 2,000BC to 700BC when people used bronze. In the Stone Age, flint was shaped and used as tools and weapons, but in the Bronze Age, stone was gradually replaced by bronze. Bronze was made by melting tin and copper, and mixing them together.

The **Iron Age** was a time in early human history when people began to use tools and weapons made of iron.

#### Fireworks frighten animals

Give your dog or cat somewhere to hide that they have access to at all times. E.g. under furniture or in a cupboard.

Walk dogs during daylight hours. Keep dogs and cats indoors when fireworks are likely to be set off.

At nightfall close windows and curtains. Put on music to mask the sound of fireworks. It's fine to comfort your pet if it helps them relax, or leave them alone unless you think they will harm themselves.

Never punish your pets when they're scared as this will only makes things worse in the long run.

> Make sure your pet can't escape if there's a sudden noise. Have them microchipped just in case.
