The school is closely situated to a Community Centre in Gales Place which hosts a daily playgroup.

The roads surrounding the school (Gales Drive, North Road and Crossways) are residential with a 30mph speed limit. School Lane to the south of the school is used by pedestrians only although it is sometimes used by emergency vehicles to access the school. There is now a new traffic light crossing on Gales Drive, outside LB1 providing safer access to both sites and between the two sites.

The school has an SSC (Specialist provision for children with Speech and Language disorders) which takes children from all areas of West Sussex. The main catchment area is local children from the Three Bridges area and surrounding neighbourhoods.

As you move further away from the school site, pavements are narrow in places and uneven. Mitchells Road in particular needs repair but the Local Highway Team are aware of this issue. A walking audit has been commissioned to identify a walking route from a park and stride site and this is discussed in more depth later in the travel plan.
Cycling Routes*	There are no designated cycle routes leading to the school. However, the school are working with the Bike It officer to identify safer routes.





Modal Shift





Staff Survey Comments

General traffic

Public transport is limited from East Grinstead to Crawley and journey times are lengthly and often delayed on bus routes.

Rain

Heavy traffic into and out of Crawley at peak times.

Heavy traffic on A24. Heavy traffic in and out of Crawley resulting in over an hour in the car on most days.

Heavy traffic, particularly when there are train strikes.

I usually bring the car to work as I do not go straight home after work.

Journey by car usually fairly problematic due to traffic congestion

Not enough car parking spaces and restricted parking zones around school

Take my children to child minders on the way to school. Traffic is slow moving on the Horsham bypass.

Although it would be nice to get a train and walk either end this would take about 4 times as long as i live a 30 minute walk from the station. Also carrying tons of books would be impossible.

Root is very dangerous for cycling.
