
Home learning grid - Spring 1

Create a presentation of each phase of the moon over 28 days. Make sure you label each phase with the scientific name.




Take photographs of the moon on different days - use the diagram below to label your pictures.


Fresh Start group: Learn any words that you have found tricky each week (green and red words).


