Why it's important to get your child vaccinated

Routine vaccinations play a huge part in protecting you, your child, and the community against a range of unpleasant and often serious childhood diseases, such as measles. In recent years there has been a gradual decline in up-take of childhood immunisations in West Sussex, so it's important that children get vaccinated when they are invited to do so. By ensuring your child is vaccinated you are helping to protect, not only your child, but also family members, as well as keeping others safe in the community. 


Young Voices


When we got back, all the kids were shattered, but if they are tired then I guess they had a good time!








Young Artists' Summer Show

Should I keep my child off school?

Sickness and Diarrhoea 48 Hour Rule

If your child has a bout of sickness or diarrhoea you must follow the 48 hour sickness and diarrhoea rule.


From time to time children are sick either at home or at school. Unfortunately, it is not possible to distinguish between the causes and therefore it is essential that the same rule of exclusion applies in all cases of vomiting or diarrhoea.

Diarrhoea and/or vomiting commonly affects children and staff and can be caused by a number of different germs including viruses, parasites and bacteria. Infections can be easily spread from person to person (by unwashed hands), especially in children.

In general, it is recommended that any staff member or child with diarrhoea and/or vomiting symptoms must stay away from the school until they have been **free of symptoms for 48 hours** and feel well.

If your child is sick or has diarrhoea at school, we will ask you or your emergency contact to take your child home. They should not return for 48 hours to school.

We appreciate that this is inconvenient in many cases and you may not believe your child is ill, but you will appreciate that we do this in all cases and it should reduce the risk of infection for all staff and children in school. So for example, if your child is sick at lunchtime on a Tuesday, they should not return to school until after lunch on Thursday, provided there have not been any further episodes of vomiting and/or diarrhoea.





Bucket therapy was created by Gina Davies and is part of a four-stage "Attention Autism Activity". However, it works very well with all children within any setting and is very easy to implement.

Bucket therapy aims to support children's attention skills, helping them to develop and maintain focus for longer periods of time. With little preparation and just a few cheap props, the activity can be done anywhere.

The 'bucket' is a non-see-through container/bag, that holds a selection of small objects such as; wind-up, pop-up, musical or mechanical toys the children will find visually appealing, but which they have never seen before. Novelty value is key, so you need to build up a collection of lots of different items to maintain the element of surprise.
