Dear Parents and Carers,

The storms have caused a small amount of damage on school grounds; you may have noticed the large branch by the upper site entrance. This is being removed soon. I hope that you and your families have stayed safe over the past few days. The weather is so unpredictable so please make sure your child has a warm, waterproof coat in school so that they can enjoy joining in outside activities.

#### Highlights of the week

#### Dogs

Please do not tie your dog against the school fences or gates. As we have so many children and parents at drop off and pick up times, it can be very distressing for your dog to be left. Also, we do have a lot of children and parents who find it difficult to walk past a barking dog. All dogs that are on school premises must be carried at all times please. Thank you for your co-operation with this.

#### Uniform

We have noticed how smart the children are in school, thank you. Our school colours are navy and grey so if your child is not wearing a jumper or cardigan with a logo, please make sure they are at least wearing the correct school colours, including black school shoes. We are working hard to raise expectations and standards so staff will contact parents/carers of children who are not wearing the correct uniform.

#### Absence from school

Please contact us via the Studybugs app if you are reporting your child absent from school. My office team will call families whose children have not arrived so it is helpful if you can leave a message. Please remember that we are unable to authorise your child's absence if you are poorly.

#### Online behaviour

We receive a lot of messages from parents who are concerned about either their child or another child's online behaviour. Please check what your child is doing online, especially chats. We have heard that there are issues with WhatsApp where children are feeling bullied by messages that are being sent between class mates. If you are concerned about messages your child is receiving, you can report this to the police on 101, as it is an offence to bully someone online. It is difficult when this behaviour affects children's emotional well-being and their relationships with friends in school. Please keep a close eye on what your child is up to online!

We are looking forward to next week's bedtime experiences for nursery and Reception. I hope that Year 3 and 4 parents will enjoy their Reading Afternoons too. These have been very well received so far!





Mae C. Jemison became the first African American woman to go into space.


Dr. Jemison was the science mission specialist on the flight.

During the shuttle mission she conducted experiments in life sciences, material sciences, and was co-investigator in the bone cell research experiment.



# Should I keep my child off school?

#### Sickness and Diarrhoea 48 Hour Rule

If your child has a bout of sickness or diarrhoea you must follow the 48 hour sickness and diarrhoea rule.


From time to time children are sick either at home or at school. Unfortunately, it is not possible to distinguish between the causes and therefore it is essential that the same rule of exclusion applies in all cases of vomiting or diarrhoea.

Diarrhoea and/or vomiting commonly affects children and staff and can be caused by a number of different germs including viruses, parasites and bacteria. Infections can be easily spread from person to person (by unwashed hands), especially in children.

In general, it is recommended that any staff member or child with diarrhoea and/or vomiting symptoms must stay away from the school until they have been **free of symptoms for 48 hours** and feel well.

If your child is sick or has diarrhoea at school, we will ask you or your emergency contact to take your child home. They should not return for 48 hours to school.

We appreciate that this is inconvenient in many cases and you may not believe your child is ill, but you will appreciate that we do this in all cases and it should reduce the risk of infection for all staff and children in school. So for example, if your child is sick at lunchtime on a Tuesday, they should not return to school until after lunch on Thursday, provided there have not been any further episodes of vomiting and/or diarrhoea.






