We do not tolerate bullying in school and we all need to work together to stop it from happening outside of school. If you are worried about your child being bullied in school please do contact us so that we can deal with it.

If you are finding it difficult to order meals for your child, please do ask us to help. The school is able to order meals on your behalf. There have been some issues with booking and this can result in children not having their choice of meal. That said, our lovely Chartwells staff are very good at making sure the children do have a meal they like!
