I have been in contact with the police and they are happy to follow up any cyber bullying incidents directly with families concerned. Either report online or on 101. We do not tolerate bullying in school and we all need to work together to stop it from happening outside of school. If you are worried about your child being bullied in school please do contact us so that we can deal with it.
