Maths Home Learning (Year 5)

1) Maths Homework for books:

On Fridays we will post on ClassDojo a link to a video covering the children's learning from the previous week, with a worksheet. It has questions and worked answers to go through. Your child can write their answers in their books.

Further activities:

2) Your child has been given their login for Times Tables Rock Stars. We expect the children to log in for 30 minutes each week at least - perhaps in two 15 minute sessions.

3) When we start a new Maths topic, we will post a quiz booklet (with answers) on ClassDojo for you to work through.

Writing Home Learning (Year 5)

Each Friday on Class Dojo we will post a writing prompt for the children. This could be a scenario, an idea, or even a picture. The children can respond to this with a piece of writing and be as creative as they like.

For instance, for the prompt "Storm", responses could be

- A non-fiction piece about storms
- A newspaper report
- A poem
- A story about a storm

The children can return this to us in lots of ways - typed or written. It might be helpful for the children to practise their typing skills!

Spelling Home Learning (Year 5)

On Mondays on ClassDojo we will post the children's spelling words for the week. They can practice these at home and write them out in their book.

On Mondays at school we will test the children on the previous week's spelling words.

On Fridays on ClassDojo we will post a spelling homework sheet for the children.



Reading Home Learning (Year 5)

This year we are not using a logging system for reading with your child. We recommend that you should read with your child - having them read to you to develop their confidence and comprehension - every day.

Children can log this at school by reporting to their teacher what they have read - we love to hear what the children are reading!

We will discuss children's reading at school in BookTalk sessions.

Foundation Subjects Home Learning (Spring)

These can be completed at any point over the term in any order. The children might find these easier to complete the more learning they have done.

History:

Maya Research Fact File

Create a fact file with at least 5 interesting facts about the Classical Maya civilisation. They could include things like food, writing, temples, or daily life.

Art:

Design a Retro-Futurist Robot

Sketch a robot or cityscape in a retro-futurist style. Label the features that make it look "retro" and "futurist".

Texture Hunt for Printing

Find 5 interesting textures at home (e.g. leaves, fabric, bubble wrap). Do rubbings of them in your book to test what could be used for printing.

Music:

Blues Playlist & Reflection

Listen to two Blues songs at home (with an adult's help, if needed). Write down their titles and 3 words to describe how each song makes you feel.

Write a Blues Verse

Write your own 4-line verse in the style of Blues lyrics. (They can use the pattern of repeating a line twice, then adding a different third line.)

Computing:

Binary Name Code

Use a simple binary alphabet chart to write your first name in binary.

Decorate the binary "code" to make it colourful.

PSHE:

Online Safety Poster

Design a poster for younger children with 3 top tips for staying safe online. Use clear writing and bright colours.
