

# Home learning grid - Autumn Term - Campania and My Region

Here are the activities available for your child's home learning. The expectation is that they complete 1 activity a week from the range of subjects provided. Please make sure it's handed in by Friday of each week! Have fun!

Geography tasks	Home and Away	RE
<p>Research and compare the weather in an Italian city (e.g., Naples) with a South East England city (e.g., Brighton) over one week. Present your data in an interesting way!</p> 	<p>Visit somewhere in the South East. Could you take a photo of a landmark and show the class, describing why it is important?</p> 	<p>We are learning about Sikhism in Autumn 1 and Christianity in Autumn 2. Create a mini booklet explaining the 5 K's. Make a story board of the key events leading up to the birth of Jesus Christ.</p>
<p>Create two postcards: one showing a key feature of the Campagna region (e.g., Naples, Mt. Vesuvius, Amalfi Coast) and another depicting a key feature of South East England (e.g., the South Downs, Chichester Cathedral, or Brighton beach). Write a letter on the back to a pen pal in the other region explaining either what life is like in Italy or England.</p> 	<p><b>Fact page</b> Create a fact page on a city of your choice. What is their national dish? What is their currency? What is the famous landmark? Where is the city? What language do they speak?</p> 	<p><b>Library</b> Visit Crawley Library. Choose a new book and write a short explanation why you chose it. You may like to add a picture of the front cover. Bring the book into school to show the class.</p> 
<p>Make some Italian food at home! Follow a recipe to create a pastas recipe or recreate another pizza! Recipe:</p> 	<p><b>London</b> Can you think of 5 questions you would like to ask a person who lived in the city of London? Remember to ask questions that will not give a yes or no answer. Example: What is it like to live there?</p>	<p><b>Author</b> Pick one of the authors (or your own choice). Adam Blade, Tom Percival, Liz Pichon or Tom Fletcher. Find out who they are and what books they have written. Create a poster all about them. You can= do this in your books or digitally.</p> 
<p><b>PSHE</b></p>	<p><b>Art</b> <b>Graffiti</b> Create your own tag name in the style of a graffiti artist.</p> 	<p><b>Geography</b></p>
<p><b>Families and relationships</b> - Make a short comic showing how you and your family spend time together. - Interview a family member about their childhood and write down one thing that was the same and one thing that was different compared to your own life. - Make a poster on how people can solve disagreements in a kind and fair way</p>	<p><b>Science</b> <b>Living things and their habitats</b> - Go into your garden, park, or even your home. Try to spot living things in different habitats., can you draw a picture of what you find? - Build a mini habitat model, this can be out of Lego, shoe boxes or natural materials such as leaves, stones or sticks.</p> 	<p><b>Volcanos</b> In Autumn 2 we will be learning about volcanos. - Make a colourful poster about your chosen famous volcano - include a picture, location, and one interesting fact. - Build a volcano using playdough, clay, papier-mâché, LEGO, or recycled materials. (Optional: make it erupt with baking soda + vinegar + food colouring!). There are many ideas on YouTube and other sites to inspire you!</p>
