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Attendance:

95% is where the magic happens!

Pupils with 95%+ attendance (missing 10 days or fewer) are 1.3 to 1.9 times more likely to achieve the expected standard in Key Stage 2 (SATs) and grade 5 or higher in GCSE English and Maths.

At 92% attendance, a child misses approximately 15 days of school. This level of absence is associated with lower attainment

Pupils who attend nearly every day (95-100%) in Year 6 are 30% more likely to reach the expected standard in reading, writing, and maths compared to those with 90-95% attendance.

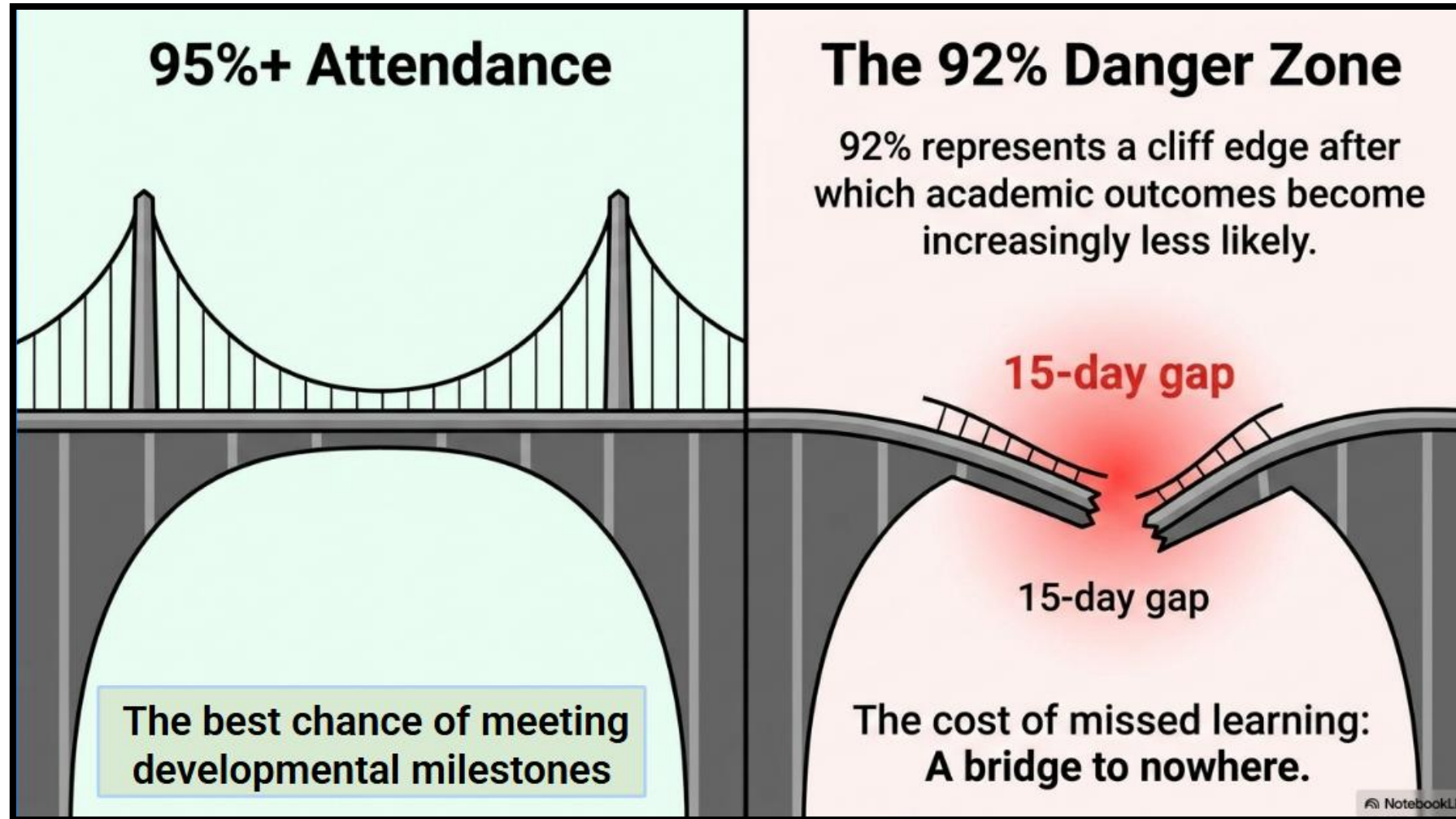

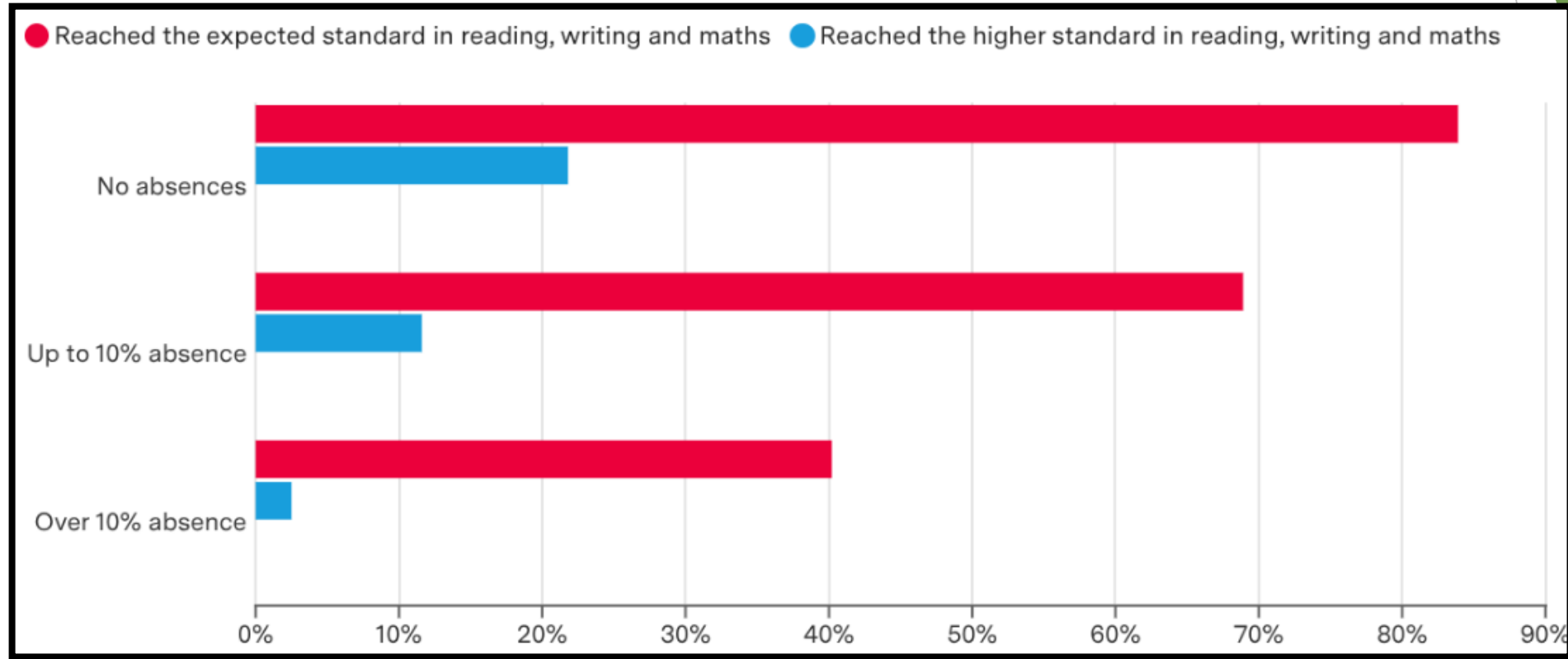

Missing Lessons has a Cumulative Effect: every day of absence carries a tangible cost to a pupil's academic progress.

Lost Learning: missed days in Year 6 are harder to recover, leading to lower confidence and higher stress.

Future Earnings: persistent absence (below 90%) by the time your child gets to secondary school can result in students earning, on average, £10,000 less at age 28.
